The tentative typology published in 'Runner Post' No. 15 (pages 270-275) included an appeal for additional information from members. Hopefully the small response indicates that it provides a fairly comprehensive and accurate coverage of the types of registration label that exist and that it is now reasonable to regard it as a definitive typology.

Only three new type elements have come to light - another different ' $R$ ' of recent vintage, a new form of the Office name and a variant of one of the original types of 'No.'. These and two new combinations of original type elements result in seven new overall Types, as described below. There are also numerous additions to the original lists of 'Recorded Offices of Use' and I would expect further discoveries.

My thanks are due to those members who contributed to the original article or to this addendum, especially Mike George, Roy Setterfield, Aubrey Glassborow and David Wall. Please continue to report new items to me.

Typology - Additions. Sub-paragraph lettering as in original article.
a. The ' R '

Type F - Squatter ( 9 mm tall) and thicker (2.75mm) than Type E. Thick, square-ended serifs. Flat-footed.
b. The Office Name

Type 6 - Two line Office name. Top line 2 mm , bottom line 1.75 mm sans serif letters.
c. The 'No.'

Type $F$ - As Type $D$ but the ' $O$ ' of 'No' underlined. The position of the underlining varies, sometimes being close to the bottom frame line - see the two illustrations of Type No. RL D5F5.
