
Port Hood Then and Now – Part 2B


View 3: South End Port Hood





View 4: Methodist Church, Port Hood, C.B.

This church, now St. Stephens United, was originally built as a Methodist Church in 1886. Given that this postcard describes it as a Methodist Church, we can presume that the photo was taken before 1925, when the Methodist, Congregationalist, and part of the Presbyterian churches in Canada amalgamated to form the United Church of Canada.





View 5: Union Church (now St. Stephens United) and Parsonage, Port Hood, N.S.

This is an image of the same church presented in View 4, however, the new description as the "union Church means that we can presume the photo was taken some time after 1925, when various churches in Canada including the Methodist church amalgamated to form the United Church of Canada.





View 6: County Academy and Presbyterian Church (Neither of the historic buildings exist any more.)
