















He was received on trial as a Methodist minister in Britannia Cove NL in 1911, Carmanville NL in 1912, and Glovertown NL in 1913. He then attended Victoria College in Toronto before serving in the First World War with the 9th Field Ambulance in France and Belgium from 1916 to 1918.

Born in Victoria, Carbonear, Newfoundland on 22 November 1888.

Upon return from the war, he was ordained in Trinity NL in 1919 and served in the church in:

- New Aberdeen NS from 1920 to 1921
- La Have NS from 1922 to 1926
- Springhill NS from 1927 to 1929
- Onslow NS from 1930 to 1931
- Red Bank NB from 1932 to 1935
- Granville Ferry NS from 1936 to 1939
- Port Hood from 1940 to 1943
- Renfrew ON from 1944 to 1946
- Rawdon ON from 1946 to 1947
- Hastings ON from 1948 to 1954 and
- Windsor from 1954 to 1967

In 1968, he retired to London ON where he passed away in 1977.
