



### Jerusalem Warehouse calling Card, 26 April 1895




### Morse's Tea – Belt Fogo on Flap-27 December 1888




### Morse's Tea – Belt Fogo on Flap – 21 October 1896



Morse's Tea – Belt Fogo on Flap – 15 August 1902




### Morse's Tea – Corner Card, Tea Box – 13 July 1908












### Morse's Tea – Corner Card, Building, Post Fire – 3 April 1943



Earliest known date is 4 March 1930, so the building was rebuilt and a new corner card printed relatively quickly after the fire. Latest know date is 30 April 1945.


### Bill from 1937, showing building as per previous cover







The building remains unchanged today with one exception. In 2013, the new owner of the building said that they were unwilling to provide free advertising and painted over the Morse's Tea advertising.



Preservation of the building was not a sure thing. In the 1960's, the development of a waterfront highway threatened its destruction, but heritage preservationists managed to halt the demolition of the building and ultimately the completion of the highway.
