
An Update to Botswana Permit Mail

This article provides additional information to the article Botswana Permit Mail, published in Forerunners issue number 102, January – April 2022, page 11.

Table 1 is a list of known Permit Mail authority numbers. The list of numbers provided in the previous article is greatly expanded with updates from a list obtained by the author in mid-2004 and only recently rediscovered. In addition, this list provides the date of issue for the Permit Mail authority numbers, where they are now known. Companies using numbers after mid-2004 have been identified through covers in the author's collection. While many blanks have been filled in, companies using Permit Mail authority numbers 10036, 10037, 10040, and 10041 are still unknown to the author at this time.

Number 10011 was first provided to Vista Cellular (PTY) Ltd., which changed its name to Orange Botswana (PTY) Ltd. in March 2003. Number 10023, previously identified as Not Known, assume a mailing service due to variety of companies, has been identified as TNT International Mail, which is indeed a mailing service. Number 10028, previously identified as Not Known, possibly Motswedi Securities has been identified as First National Bank of Botswana.

Figure 1 illustrates a copy of an information pamphlet on Permit Mail obtained in mid-2004.

- Use the specimen shown to design a Permit Mail impression that will be pre-printed on your mail
- Complete and return the enclosed application form together with a sample of your impression to us.

Permit Mail conditions of mailing

- All Permit Mail must have an authority number issued by BotswanaPost.
- The Permit Mail impression must be pre-printed in the top right hand corner of all your mail items.
- Present your mail items to us in irays, boxes or bundles with addresses facing outwards and the Permit Mail impression in the top right hand
- . Permit Mail can be accepted at any approved
- No Permit Mail items may be placed in any Post Box. We reserve the right not to deliver any Permit Mail items which are found in Post Boxes without prior payment.

- Permit Mail items will not be date stamped and
- is not necessary to allix postage stamps.

 Payment terms for the mail are agreed prior to mailing or at the time of mailing.

 You keep your Permit Mail number until it is cancelled either by yourself or BotswanaPost
- You may not use Permit Mail envelopes as reply envelopes for your customers to post back to you. Enquire about Business Reply if you want your customers to respond to you.
- If you controvene any of the conditions laid down, Botswana Post may cancel your number. We will attempt to contact you first.

How to design Your Permit Mail impression



- Design your Permit Mail impression according to the specimen detailed above.
- You may use any colour for your Permit Mail impression as long as the other conditions are achered to
- Please have your envelope design approved prior to printing by faxing it to (267) 352848.

Forerunners Forum

Cape of Good Hope Cover and the Robert Taylor Collection

Hendrik Geyer asked in Forerunners #112 the present whereabouts of a cover from the Taylor collection. Colin Fraser emailed to say that "Bob Taylor's collection was sold intact by him to a client many years ago and before Bob's death. As the clients's interests evolved, most of the collection was resold in a Spink auction in London. If one check back in their catalogues you should find the sale which was done anonymously."

With a 2019 sale by Spink, the cover may have made it into the Guy Dillaway's Cape collection. This was shown at Milcopex and the Spellman Philatelic Museum in 2017 as part of PSGSA's Africa Symposium (Forerunners #87). Guy died in 2021 (Forerunners #99) and his collection was sold by Harmers International in a couple of auctions in 2022 in rather large groups of covers, (1) but he may not have included pre-stamped material. Another possibility would be Johnny Barth's Cape collection that included pre-stamped material. It is uncertain if this collection is still intact. His collection used to be posted on Dansk Posthistorisk Selskab's website, but was at his request

recently removed. (2) Does anybody have information on the collection or its electronic versions where about?

Tony Howgrave-Graham's maritime postal history collection of South Africa contains lots of pre-stamped material but little inland mail. It is available for order from the website of the South African Collectors Society Study Groups (3) or downloaded from the website of the South African Philately Club. (4)

Other prominent Cape collections appear solely to have focused on the stamp issuing period and is thus unlikely to have contained inland stampless material. An example of these are Joseph Hackmey's Cape Triangular Collection that now are posted on Museum of Philately's website. (5)


