POST OFFICE ACT

(Cap. 72:01)

POST OFFICE (POSTAGE, TELEGRAPH AND MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1975

(Published on the 4th April, 1975)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Post Office Act, the Director of Posts and Telecommunications, with the approval of the Minister of Works and Communications, hereby makes the following Regulations —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Postage, Telegraph and Miscellaneous Charges) (Amendment) Regulations, 1975 and shall come into operation on the 1st May, 1975.

RESTRICTION OF EXTERNAL MONEY ORDER REMITTANCES

In terms of Exchange Control Regulations, no remittance may exceed R50,00 as that is the maximum amount which may be transferred in any month to countries outside the Republic of South Africa, South West Africa, Lesotho, Swaziland and Botswana.

INLAND TELEGRAPHIC MONEY ORDERS CHARGES FOR TELEGRAMS OF ADVICE

The charge for the telegram of advice of a telegraphic Money Order drawn on an office in Botswana is 25 cents irrespective of the number of words therein or the number of orders involved where the remittance exceeds R200. The remitter may, on paying for the additional words required, have a short private communication for the payee, not exceeding twelve words.

Telegrams of advice of orders drawn on offices in Lesotho, Swaziland, Republic of South Africa, Namibia, Mocambique, Rhodesia, Malawi, and Zambia are charged for in accordance with the tariff for plain language telegrams set forth in section 3 – telegrams. The remitter may, on paying for the additional words required, have a short private communication for the payee, not exceeding twelve words.

Telegrams of advice of telegraphic money orders may be sent as urgent telegrams to offices within Lesotho, Swaziland, Republic of South Africa, Namibia, Mocambique, Rhodesia, Malawi and Zambia on payment of double the telegraph rate for an ordinary advice telegram.

If alteration of the names of the payee or remitter should be required, a corrected telegraphic advice will be sent by the issuing Postmaster upon payment by the remitter of a fee of 25 cents telegraph charge in the case of Botswana. To other countries a telegraph charge on a word basis applies.

**FOREIGN MONEY ORDERS
CHARGES FOR TELEGRAMS OF ADVICE**

A charge for the telegram of advice at the ordinary or letter telegram rate, as the remitter prefers. The remitter is allowed, on paying for the additional words required, to add to the telegram of advice any short communication for the payee, not exceeding twelve words.

OTHER CHARGES

ADVICES OF PAYMENT

(Inland Money Orders) —

(a) 5 cents;

(b) if an advice of payment is required by telegraph, the remitter must pay the charge of the telegram of advice, the advice of payment fee 5 cents plus the cost of the telegraph reply.

The charge for the telegraph reply from an office in Botswana is 25 cents. From any other office the charge is in accordance with the tariff for plain language telegrams.

ADVICE OF PAYMENT

(Foreign Money Orders) —

5 cents;

(b) if the remitter wishes to request for an advice of payment to be communicated to the office of payment in the telegram of advice, he must pay the cost of the telegram including the words "ADVICE PAYMENT". The reply in such cases will be sent from the office of payment by post.
