POST OFFICE (EXPEDITED MAIL SERVICE) REGULATIONS, 1989

ARRANGEMENT OF REGULATIONS

REGULATION

1. Citation and commencement
2. Acceptance of mail for expedited delivery
3. Amendment of Schedule

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 104 of the Post Office Act, the Minister of Works, Transport and Communications hereby makes the following Regulations —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Expedited Mail Service) Regulations, 1989, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 6th November, 1989.

2. (1) Notwithstanding regulation 46 of the Post Office (Postal and Franking) Regulations, 1980, the post offices specified in Part 1 of the Schedule to these Regulations may accept for expedited delivery to the countries specified in Part 2 of the Schedule, mail items up to a maximum weight of 10 kg per item, such service being referred to as the Expedited Mail Service (or E.M.S.).

(2) The aim of the Expedited Mail Service will be to provide expedited delivery from Botswana to the countries specified within 72 hours of posting.

(3) Fees to be charged for the E.M.S. shall be those specified in Part 2 of the Schedule.

3. The Minister may, by notice in the Gazette, add to or delete from the post offices specified in Part 1 of the Schedule, and may add to or delete from the countries specified in Part 2 of the Schedule, or may from time to time amend the fees therein specified.
